Dr. Brian Bull is a Professor of Pathology and Human Anatomy in the School of Medicine. Following medical school at LLUH, Dr. Bull trained at Yale and the National Institutes of Health. He also completed Fellowships at NIH in Electron Microscopy and at the Royal Postgraduate Medical School, London, England in Hematopathology.

He's taught 45 classes of medical students, and as Program Director, has trained more than 150 pathology residents. He has also functioned as both the Department of Pathology and Human Anatomy Chair and the Dean of the School Of Medicine. He served for 10 years as Editor-in-Chief of the international Hematology Journal *Blood Cells* and has written 200+ peer-reviewed scientific papers. One of his lifelong interest has been the genesis of creativity and the Book of Genesis; a topic on which he has co-authored three books with a theologian.
